This is a free service.

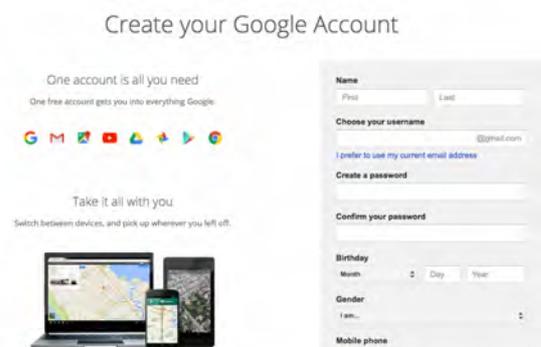
### 5 quick steps

To embed Google Translate on your website, you just follow these simple steps.

#### Step 1

If you don't already have a free Google account, you will need to create one.

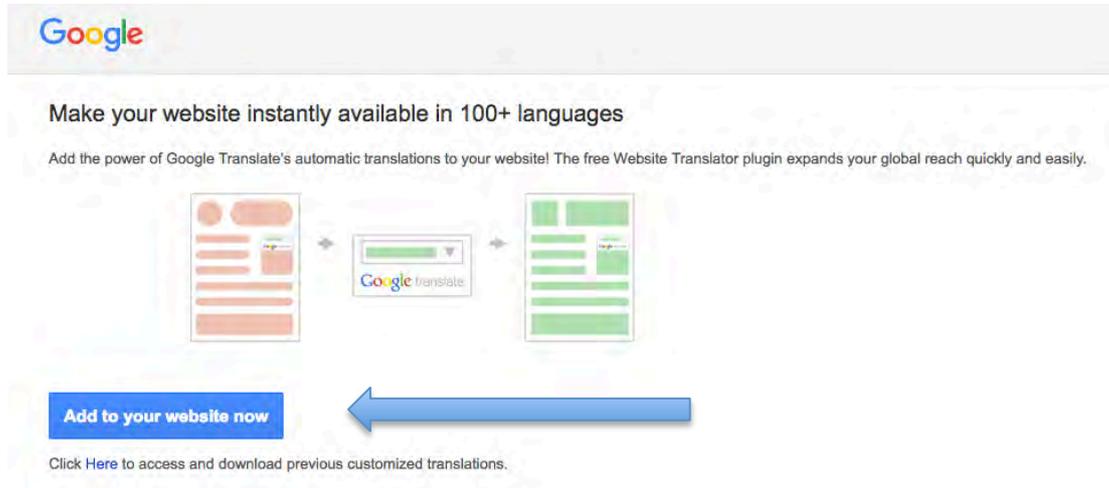
Go to this webpage to do this:

## Step 2

Then go to <https://translate.google.com/manager/website/>

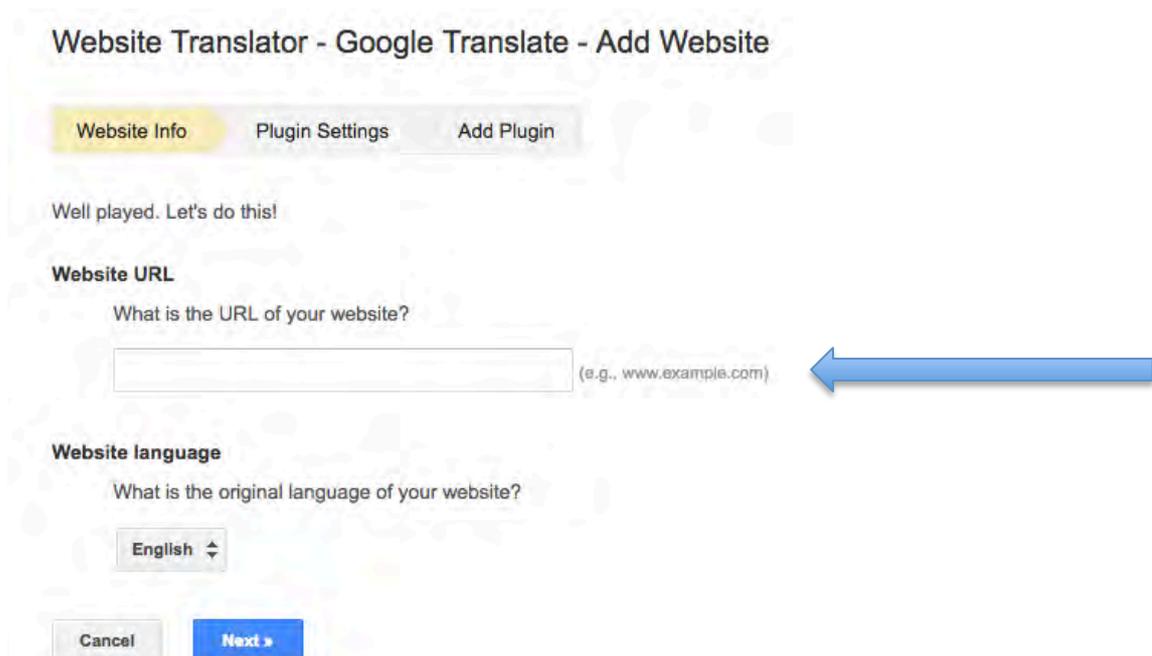
Sign in with your Google account.



Click **“Add to your website now”**.

## Step 3

On the next page, add your website URL:

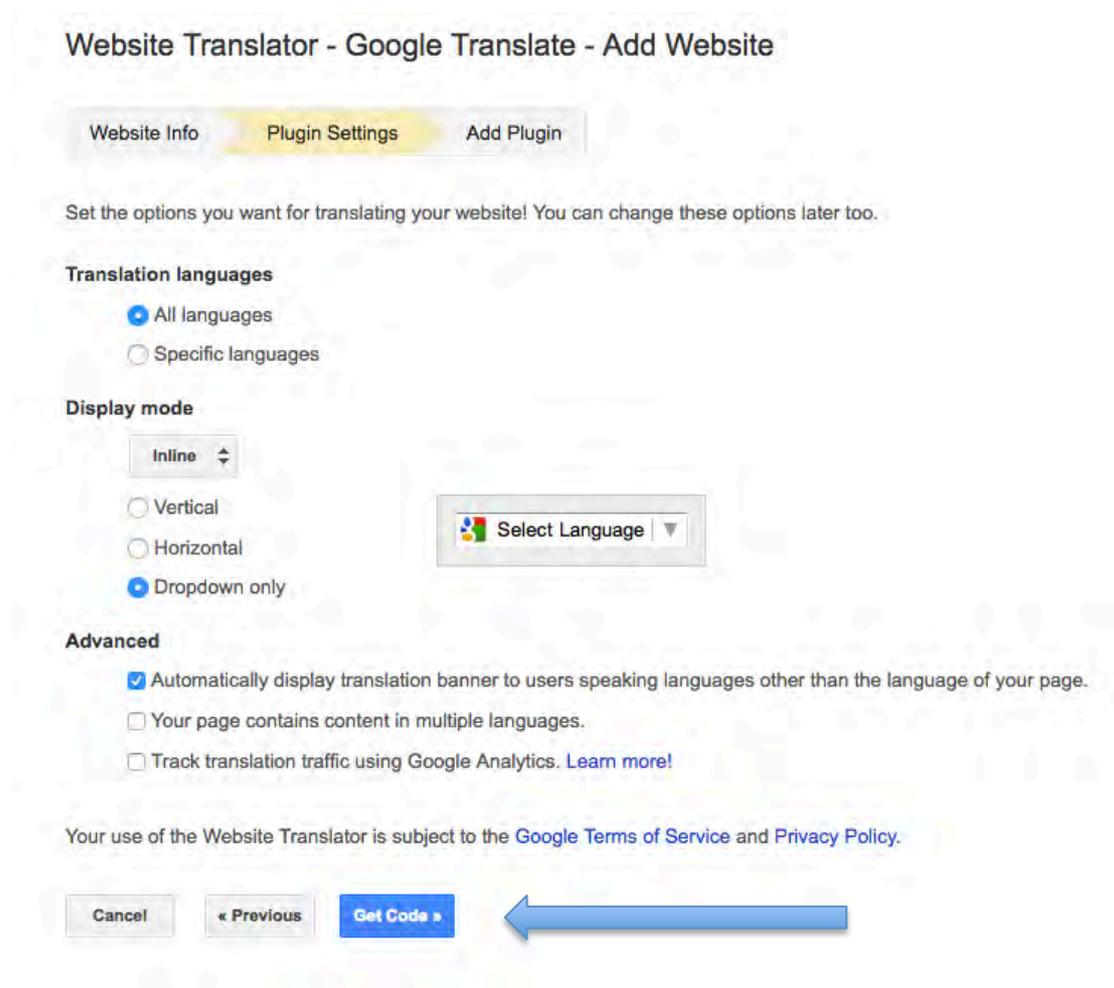


And choose your “**Website language**” from the dropdown menu.  
Click **Next**.

#### Step 4

Here you can create some customisations. You can choose whether you want to show all languages or some specific ones. You can also customize the way the Google Translate widget is displayed.

After you have made your customisation decisions, select “**Get Code**”.



#### Step 5

After you select “**Get Code**”, some code will be generated that needs to be added to your website.



### **The tricky bit**

After the web code is generated, you might need a web developer to help you add it where you want it on your website. Sometimes the code is pasted into a web widget or you will need some additional HTML coding to position it correctly
